## **GUIDE TO AUTHORS**

## 1. Types of Contributions

ISME/GLOMIS EJ (ISSN 1880-7682) accepts research articles and short communications. Research articles are original research that contributes to the scientific knowledge of mangroves. Short communications are brief reports of preliminary research with scope for publication of complete findings later.

#### 1.1 Research articles

- Each article should not exceed 2,000 words and written in English, preferably in MS Word.
- The corresponding author and co-authors should be identified with their addresses and emails.
- Text should have the following headings: Background, Materials and Methods, Results and Discussion, Conclusion, Acknowledgements, and References.
- Authors should use SI units and appropriate symbols, and tables and figures (photos) should be numbered with appropriate captions.
- For citations in the text, cite name(s) of author(s) and year, and references are to be listed in alphabetical order, by the last names of authors, e.g.

  - Wolanski, E., Mazda, Y. & Ridd, P., 1992. Mangrove hydrodynamics. In: Robertson, A.I. & Alongi, D.M. (eds.) *Tropical Mangrove Ecosystems*. American Geophysical Union, Washington D.C., p. 43–62.

#### 1.2 Short communications

Short communications would normally not exceed 1,000 words and the format is essentially the same as research articles. The text may carry different headings but sections such as Background, Conclusion, Acknowledgements and References would remain.

### 1.3 Sample papers

Sample papers are available from the archives of the journal as references for authors when preparing their manuscripts.

### 2. Submission of Manuscripts

Submission of a manuscript to the EJ represents that it has not been published previously and is not under consideration for publication elsewhere, and that the authors have authorized the transfer of the copyright to ISME.
